World Order and Peace. International Politics in the 21st Century in a Global Perspective

Two International Workshops for Early Career Researchers, Fall 2017 and 2018

In order to enhance exchange among younger scholars in the field of International Relations (IR) from around the world the "World International Studies Committee" (WISC), in line with its mandate, invites applications for participation in two international workshop on the theme "World Order and Peace. International Politics in the 21st Century in a Global Perspective". Up to twenty-five early career researchers in the field of IR will be invited to present their research at an initial weeklong intensive workshop with senior IR scholars. This workshop is scheduled for the Fall of 2017 somewhere in the Global South (details on the venue will be communicated on the website of WISC in March 2017). In a second stage the authors of the most promising papers will be invited to a second, book-making workshop scheduled for 2018.

Eligibility

Successful applicants will have a clear profile as promising scholars in the field of IR in the early stages of their career. Normally they will be members of one of the member associations of WISC (the list of WISC members is available here). However, applications are also encouraged from scholars in countries where WISC is not present, especially from the Global South.

Funding

Thanks to a generous grant from the Swiss Foundation "Avec et pour Autres" WISC will be in a position to cover all expenses (ie. travel, lodging and food) for all successful applicants.

Format

Complete applications must include: (1) a paper proposal (up to 1.000 words, excluding bibliography) specifying the research problem in the context of the broad theme "World Order and Peace. International Politics in the 21st Century in a Global Perspective" and a sketch of how this research problem will be tackled based on relevant literatures; (2) CV and list of publications; (3) up to three references.

Contact and Deadline

Applicants must submit proposals electronically to <u>wisc@soz.uni-frankfurt.de</u> using a PDF document format. Applications with all required accompanying materials contained in a single PDF, must be received by <u>March 13th, 2017</u>.

If you do not receive an email confirmation within seven days after sending your proposal, please resend it to the same address since there may have been transmission problems.

All applicants will receive notification as to whether their proposal has been accepted in late April 2017.
